

Kinematics Equations

Constant Velocity

$$v = \frac{\Delta d}{\Delta t}$$

Constant Acceleration

$$a = \frac{\Delta v}{\Delta t} \quad (\text{recall: } \Delta v = v_2 - v_1)$$

$$v_{ave} = \frac{\Delta d}{\Delta t} \quad (\text{recall: } v_{ave} = \frac{v_1 + v_2}{2})$$

ONLY when acc is constant

Maybe Useful Equations:

$$\textcircled{1} \quad \Delta d = v_1 \Delta t + \frac{1}{2} a (\Delta t)^2$$

$$\textcircled{2} \quad \Delta d = v_2 \Delta t - \frac{1}{2} a (\Delta t)^2$$

$$\textcircled{3} \quad v_2^2 = v_1^2 + 2 a \Delta d$$

always given

One More Example:

An airplane must reach a velocity of 71 m/s for takeoff. If the runway is 1.0 km long, what must the constant acceleration be?

$$V_1 = 0 \text{ m/s}$$

$$V_2^2 = V_1^2 + 2ad$$

$$V_2 = 71 \text{ m/s}$$

$$\frac{V_2^2 - V_1^2}{2ad} = \frac{2ad}{2ad}$$

$$\Delta d = 1.0 \text{ km}$$

$$a = ??$$

$$a = \frac{V_2^2 - V_1^2}{2\Delta d}$$

units: $\frac{\text{m}^2/\text{s}^2}{\text{m}}$
 m/s^2

$$a = \frac{(71 \text{ m/s})^2 - 0^2}{2(1.0 \times 10^3 \text{ m})}$$

$$a \approx 2.5 \text{ m/s}^2$$

How could you find your reaction time by using a ruler?

$$\begin{array}{l} \text{start: } d_1 \\ \text{finish: } d_2 \end{array} \left. \right\} \Delta d$$

$$\Delta d = v_i t + \frac{1}{2} a(t)^2$$

$$\Delta d = \frac{1}{2} a(t)^2$$

$$V_i = 0$$

$$\frac{2\Delta d}{a} = \frac{a(t)^2}{a}$$

$$a = 9.81 \text{ m/s}^2$$

$$\Delta t = ?$$

$$(t)^2 = \frac{2\Delta d}{a}$$

$$\Delta t = \sqrt{\frac{2\Delta d}{a}}$$
