




WILLIAM MORRIS

1834 - 1896

WILLIAM MORRIS

- 24 March 1834 3 October 1896
- English textile designer, artist, and writer.
- A major contributor to reviving traditional textile arts and methods of production.
- Most famous for his wallpapers and textiles.
- Also a writer of poetry, fiction, essays, and translations of ancient and medieval texts.
- Helped to establish the modern fantasy genre.



WALLPAPER DESIGN

- Major influence on wallpaper design
- Created over 50 designs.
- His sources were plants themselves and also images of plants in 16th-century woodcuts, manuscripts, tapestries and other floral textiles.
- By the late 1890s Morris wallpapers were commonly found in middle-class homes.
- Many of his designs are still popular today.
- "Almost all the designs we use for surface decoration, wallpapers, textiles, and the like, I design myself." (1883)




'Trellis' woodblock printed wallpaper. (1864)

1840 - 1893

PETER ILYICH TCHAIKOVSKY



- 7 May 1840 6 November 1893
- Russian composer.
- His works
 include symphonies, concertos, operas,
 ballets, chamber music, and a choral.
 - Some of these are among the most popular theatrical music in the classical repertoire.
- The first Russian composer whose music made a lasting impression internationally.


FAMOUS WORKS

- Composed 169 pieces, including symphonies, operas, ballets, concertos, cantatas and songs.
- Some of his more famous works are:
 - Swan Lake (ballet) (1875)
 - The Sleeping Beauty (ballet) (1889)
 - The Nutcracker (ballet) (1891)









LEWIS CARROLL

1832 - 1898

LEWIS CARROLL


- 27 January 1832 14 January 1898
- English author and mathematician.
- Wrote several novels, short stories and mathematical works and also contributed to political pamphlets.
- Although his fame and success came from writing children's books, he saw himself as a man of science and mathematics.




FAMOUS WORKS

- Published around 25 works, including literary works, poetry, mathematical works and books on government.
- Some of his more famous works are:
 - Alice's Adventures in Wonderland (1865)
 - Through the Looking-Glass and What Alice Found There (1871)
 - The Hunting of the Snark (1876)
 - Sylvie and Bruno (1889)
