- 1. What does Banquo's opening soliloquy reveal about his character?
- 2. What reasons does Macbeth offer why Banquo must be killed? Outline all the reasons why Macbeth wants to Kill Banquo.
- 3. Rather than order the murderers to kill Banquo, Macbeth converses with them at length. Why?
- 4. What is the state of mind of both Lady Macbeth and Macbeth in III.ii? What reasons are suggested?
- 5. In scene ii, Macbeth states that he will "...Acquaint you with the perfect spy o'th'time... (III.i. 129). How much does the third murderer know of Banquo's habits?
- 6. Scene iv marks the beginning of Macbeth's downfall. List the various setbacks he suffers during this scene.
- 7. Compare and articulate the behaviour of the two Macbeths during scene iv.
- 8. What is the dramatic purpose of scene vi?
- 9. In a five act play, Act III is considered the climax. By the end of this act, what features have presented themselves that appear climactic?
