- 5. Why is it appropriate that Malcolm give the order to cut down trees for use as camouflage in scene 4?
- 6. Explain the metaphor used in Macbeth's "Tomorrow and tomorrow..." (V.v.18) soliloquy.
- 7. What is Macbeth's mood by the end of scene 5?
- 8. What dramatic purpose is served by Macbeth fighting and killing Young Siward?
- 9. What was Siward's response upon hearing the news of his son's death (scene 8)?
- 10. What kingly qualities does Malcolm display in his last speech?
